## LEAVES FROM THE RECTOR'S DIARY

## March 15

Mothering Sunday, and unfortunately some people turned up at St Mary's Compton Dando where there was no service scheduled for this Sunday. We did advertise the services times, but... Sorry about that, but good numbers came to Publow and Chelwood.

### March 16

By train, easily and relatively inexpensively, to Cambridge for Gabriel's birthday. But first Paula entertained me to lunch in the Michaelchurch, one of those inner city medieval churches which have other activities besides worship each day of the week. The chancel was full of people engaged in some Lent Course, and the café in nave and aisles was full. The food is very good, the whole enterprise is run by caterers who have pulled out of St Mary le Bow (The Bow Bells Church) in central London, and now concentrate on their restaurants in Cambridge and All Saints Hereford.

### March 17

A week for travelling - to Shrivenham today to see Philip and Helen Harper, and Harriet and where the family is now settled. The walk through the park with the dogs was wonderful. Helen seemed to know everyone we met.

## March 18

I am already getting bored with election speeches and promises. Each party naturally tries to woo us by telling us how much better off we shall be if we cast our vote for them. That's understandable, but what are our priorities as a nation? What of justice, fairness, freedom and peace? I have never wanted to be a politician.

## March 27

Bobbie Roberts' ashes in the grave of her first husband. She used to talk often about this village in which she had lived for several years. and I half expected this to be a scenic Devon beauty spot. I have no idea why - I thought it was a bit dismal in the drizzle, which did not let up while we were there.

## March 29

Palm Sunday, and so Holy week begins. Although we had daily services, a funeral, and a visiting preaching engagement in Keynsham, it seemed a bit of a doddle after what I had been used to. Not so Good Friday. Publow Church was pretty full of children and adults for a two hour session during the morning when the events of Holy Week and Easter were re-enacted through story, crafts, singing and prayer. Highly successful. In the evening to Bath Abbey to listen to the Girls' and Men's choir there sing Stainer's "Crucifixion" Superb.

## April 6

The Forest of Dean has always had a particular appeal for me since I first encountered it - at Blakney - on a Teaching Practice in 1959. Today we took the opportunity of a long walk designed for dogs, ending up with a meal at The Speech House near Cinderford.

## April 12

The casual reader of my Diary notes may well ask, "Where's the religion in what this parson writes? Where's his faith? What is his gospel? He hasn't said anything about God or Jesus..." No: I am not convinced that religious talk so called, gets us very far these days. 


## Christian Aid Week 10-16th May 2015

## Churches working together The future of our buildings

During Lent, Canon John led three very stimulating discussions in the three parishes in the Benefice, on the subject of the future of our churches. Attending were regular churchgoers, together with those who attend less often or never. Total attendance was over 70, so a good crosssection of our village populations.

The three buildings are hugely valued as historic places at the heart of our communities. There was a general feeling that they must be maintained at all costs. Fortunately, all are in good physical condition at present and finances are in reasonable shape, albeit without substantial reserves to deal with an emergency such as has befallen some local churches recently, with roofs falling in (Dundry) and bells falling down (Kilmersdon). The buildings are widely used for major local and family occasions -weddings, funerals, baptisms, harvest festivals, Christmas and Easter. There is a feeling that they could be used even more but not in an inappropriate manner nor at the expense of the village halls.

Any church community is, of course, about much more than its building – indeed Jesus managed very well indeed without any buildings at all. Worship must be at the heart of the churches' activities. The meetings heard that we may be fortunate enough for the next Rector to be all are invited.

given more theoretical working hours than our recent Rectors - although it is hard to see how much more could reasonably have been expected of Rev. Geoff Calway and Canon John Simpson. There is though always a never-ending demand both to give support to the community and to sustain the life of our three churches. One approach to consider is to find ways of introducing lay ministry in order to maintain a regular pattern of frequent services in all three churches.

Further, all wish to maintain and even increase the already good work with children. Contact with the increasing numbers of older people in our villages is vital church work too. In order to make best use of time, and to better coordinate all that goes on within our Benefice, the churchwardens are looking at ways of reducing administrative burdens on both Rector and volunteers and perhaps to find central funding for a Benefice administrator.

The wardens of all three parishes are working on a new "Benefice Profile" which is effectively a prospectus for our next Rector. This profile will seek to address all the above matters and it will be discussed in detail at a meeting to be held at Compton Dando village hall on Wednesday, 13th May at 7.30pm to which

## Chew Valley Gardening Society News

At our April meeting Sally Gregson gave us a very informative and interesting talk, on the history of Cottage Gardens, covering the period from around 1500 to date.

In the 16th Century farmland belonged to the local lord, the landowner, and went up to the cottage doors, so there were no gardens, but there were lots of herbs, both medicinal and culinary, and fruit which people could harvest from the countryside. By the 18th Century, some enlightened

landowners had introduced the concept of vegetable competitions or shows to

encourage their tenants to grow vegetables in the gardens which they were now providing with the cottages. It was at this point that people started to grow flowers as well as vegetables.

Subsequently, the cottage garden concept was also used in some of the great houses and by well-known gardeners like Vita Sackville West at Sissinghurst and Christopher Lloyd at Great Dixter. We wait with interest to see how the cottage garden concept will develop in the 21st-century.




