Be in your Church where ever that might be and welcome in our Lord, make Christmas special because it is special. Enjoy it for all that it means. Share that joy with others so that when the New Year comes we will be prepared certain in the knowledge that the love of God has come to earth to be with us in all that we do and say.

Rejoice and be glad. May you all have a thoughtful Advent, a joyous Christmas and a holy and blessed New Year.


