-Parish Ponderings -

Happy New Year. It's about a month before Ash Wednesday but it's still the season of Epiphany in the Church of England. Epiphany is from the Greek word 'epiphaneia', meaning "manifestation" or "appearance commemorating the visit of the Magi or wise men to Jesus". So why is Epiphany a season in the Church?

Someone who knew I was about to prepare my February article, asked me "Do you recycle your sermons and messages from year to year?" My "no" was met with surprised disbelief. Then the following... "They're just words on a page. Surely you use them again and again." "No." What followed was, "I'm sure at some point religion will go the way of AI and it will be doing it."

That may be true. But computers can't replicate THE Epiphany...the revelation of Jesus Christ to the world. The manifestation of God's love and salvation for all people of every tribe, tongue and nation on the earth for all time. The truth of Jesus manifested in the world cannot be mimicked. He can't be replicated by anything man made. Humanity is uniquely made in God's image when God breathed life in us. We have a soul = our mind, will and emotions. We also have an eternal spirit because we're created to have relationship with eternal God. God sent his one and only Son Jesus into the world so that the world would know God and we might live through him. 1 John 4:9. Jesus also gave us the gift of the Holy Spirit to know God and live in peace with him.

It's evident that many in the world do not want peace in relationship with others or with God. Why is this so? Let's imagine for a moment that there is no god of any kind to be answerable to, nor to intervene and save us from, ourselves and our capacity for self-destruction. Now, who do we blame for the suffering in the world? Logically. it must be ourselves. So then, where does sacrificial love come from? Or a sense of justice? Where does peace come from that we so desperately long for?

Now, let's imagine there is a God that we might turn to. That He loves us totally. Because of that love He did do something about our problems. He became like us, was born like us. Lived and died for us. He proved he was God by rising to life again. Most importantly we are free to choose the love and peace he offers us eternally or the way we're doing things. Which would you choose? This is the Epiphany and Lent. Let's share both together.

Postmaster's Award

We all know how much we value their unstinting commitment to their local, and wider, community and thank them for their continuing presence amongst us. We are blessed to have you.

All Saints' Carol Service

The Carol Service was very well attended and the congregation sang heartily in support of the large benefice choir. Richard Sanders, our young organist and choirmaster, had put together a wonderful, traditional service and the choir produced some outstanding singing with soaring descants, supported by a trumpet which really set it off.

Three students from Pensford Primary School were among the readers and they did themselves, their families and their school proud. The combined collection from All Saints' and St. Mary's carol services raised £406.82 which has been forwarded to Shelter.

All Saints' Tower

The 14th Century builders of All Saints' did a stunning job. Considering that it is so close to the River Chew, which has notoriously flooded many times over the centuries, it has suffered very little flood damage, unlike St. Thomas Becket in Pensford half a mile up stream.

However, the large volume of water which has to be taken away from the building whenever it rains - and it certainly rains in this part of the world, particularly in recent months - has recently caused problems. The guttering and down pipes do a great job but taking the water away to the River Chew has not worked well recently. The result is dampness in the tower walls and uncertain amounts of degradation of the footings of the tower and the rest of the church. Clearly, we cannot allow this to continue. Are there soakaways, dispersing the water around the churchyard or is the water conducted into the river directly through pipes? To date we have not been able to discover, despite enlisting expert help and attempting to trace the course using dye. We now have permission to dig in the

We now have permission to dig in the churchyard to try to solve the problem. We shall start with a trial pit close to the South West corner of the tower. The work will be supervised by a qualified archaeologist and the church architect and should not cause too much disruption. We must hope that the solution is quickly found and at not too great cost. We must continue to conserve this wonderful building.

Our precious gift

As Christians, while we may look to reduce our own carbon footprint, we are called to be stewards and witnesses of a much more radical resource. The clue is in the word 'ecology'. 'Eco' comes from the Greek word oikos, meaning house, or dwelling place. Ecology is partly about our responsibility to recognise the precious gift of the Earth, as our dwelling place: to be thankful, and play our part. God made humankind to care for the earthly world: Jesus amplifies the call, as He uses 'nature' as the sign



of how we can live in order to flourish and to fulfil God's will.

'Logy' comes from a Greek word logos interpreted as reason, the ordering of knowledge, logic. In John's Gospel, logos is a word to describe Jesus - through whom all things are made and from whom all true knowledge comes. Logos is the word, the source of all goodness and grace, for every human life, and for all of creation.

It is the 'logos', the word, who inhabits our lives, our creation - inviting us to recognise His light, and allow it to overcome the darkness of our own limited concerns and agendas. We meet the logos in scripture, in worship, in prayer, and deeper reflection.

In Jesus, as logos, we can find the wisdom, the resources and the commitment to play our part in caring for creation. We are able to invite others to recognise the deeper truths about Eco, our common dwelling place, and to see more clearly how we join with others to work out what to do, how to live, and honour the gift of life that we receive through Him. The Logos is the possibility of good news for humankind and for the Earth.

What a responsibility each Christian disciple is called to bear! And what grace can be ours to enable us to fulfil our calling, and help all of God's children become caught up in the praise and prayer that gives true life to our dwelling place, and to exercise our stewardship appropriately.

Read John 1v1-14. Become an ECO-warrior - committed our common dwelling place - through celebrating the power and presence of the LOGOS. ECOLOGY: we know it makes sense.

Vacancy for a Parish Flood Representative

Working as a community is a sensible way to help reduce the impacts of a shared flood risk. In view of the recent spate of wet weather, swollen rivers and flooded roads, the Parish Council is seeking to fill the vacant post of Parish Flood Representative.

Our Parish Flood Representative would be a designated individual who would work in conjunction with the Parish Council to liaise with Bath & North East Somerset Council's Drainage & Flooding team. The individual would provide an important communication link between the whole of our Parish and the Flood Risk Management authorities on issues such as:

- land drainage
- surface water flooding
- groundwater flooding
- watercourse flooding

It should be emphasised that this position is NOT a flood emergency role. It is primarily concerned with the reporting of ongoing local land drainage and flooding issues in order to come up with practical solutions for long-term improvements. No technical knowledge of drainage or flooding is required, what's more important is that the Flood Representative is willing to gather information about drainage issues within our Parish and pass this on to Bath and North East Somerset Council' Drainage and Flooding team.

The Parish Flood Representative would also make a parish flood plan, keep it up to date and provide information and advice to residents on how to keep safe during flooding.

This is a voluntary, unpaid role. The individual does not need to be a Parish Councillor or attend regular Parish Council meetings. Any member of the public is welcome to apply but the nomination would need to be agreed with the Parish Council.
