Praying In Difficult Times

Conflict is a part of life that we all experience in various ways. But for many in the world today conflict is happening that is destroying any hope of a peaceful life and livelihood or future. What can we do about that? We can pray. Ephesians 6:10-18 says, "Be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. Put on all of God's armour so that you will be able to stand firm against all strategies of the devil. For we are not fighting against flesh-and-blood enemies, but against evil rulers and authorities of the unseen world, against mighty powers in this dark world, and against evil spirits in the heavenly places. Therefore, put on every piece of God's armour so you will be able to resist the enemy in the time of evil. Then after the battle you will still be standing firm. Stand your ground, putting on the belt of truth and the body armour of God's righteousness. For shoes, put on the peace that comes from the Good News so that you will be fully prepared. In addition to all of these, hold up the shield of faith to stop the fiery arrows of the devil. Put on salvation as your helmet, and take the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. Pray in the Spirit at all times and on every occasion. Stay alert and be persistent in your prayers"

Oswald Chambers said, "Jesus Christ carries on intercession for us in heaven; the Holy Ghost carries on intercession in us on earth; and we the saints have to carry on intercession for all men. Our prayers are heard, not because we are in earnest, not because we suffer, but because Jesus suffered."

So, to help answer the question how do we pray in difficult and complicated times, the answer is just pray. Shut the door and talk to God. He hears all of us, all the time. "When we tell God what we know he knows, he then helps us know it the way he does."

Time to re-member

I am shortly leaving Bath and Wells for a time to serve as interim Acting Diocesan Bishop in the Diocese of Coventry. You may know that the city of Coventry saw some very heavy shelling during World War 2, which resulted in the destruction of the Cathedral.

A new Cathedral has since been built and stands alongside the old ruin as a testament of hope. Though different in style, there's a harmony of old and new. It shows us where conflict can destroy, peace can be found as we seek to live together as the people of God.



This marrying of modern and traditional styles

of architecture, helps us to consider how we fashion the life we are called to live as Christians in our communities. It is not that we put aside our differences nor require others to conform to our own shape or form. Rather we recognise the value of listening fully to others and learn to hear the voice of God. Determining to value the worth of each contribution and discerning together a faithful walk with God.

This season of Remembrance encourages us to look back and to value the contributions of those who have gone before us, giving their lives in the service of others. It is not about glorifying the concept of war and conflict but the desire to establish a peaceful world for all. As we look back, so we are invited to look forward and commit to establishing a world where all have a place and where the Prince of Peace, Jesus, is our example.

Coventry is the home to the Community of the Cross of Nails. A community of reconciliation based around the cross fashioned by iron nails found within the ruins of the Cathedral following the fire. Its mission is to live out the practice of peace-building, encouraging people across the world to learn to be reconciled with themselves and one another, as they find reconciliation with God, through Christ.

As I leave here, I do so with plenty of memories, many happy, occasionally sad. Often the latter are those where I have got things wrong and failed to live up to my calling to be the grace-filled child of God I long to be. So, if I have let you down, I am sorry and please pray for me, as I will for you, that God continues to reconcile us to Himself and to one another.

And as we hold our acts of remembrance this month, may we become re-membered (put back together), as the people of God.

Growing success at Great Avon Wood

Great Avon Wood is a ground-breaking partnership between local charities, Avon Needs Trees and the Forest of Avon Trust. The 100-acre woodland is near the village of Pensford. Over the summer a dedicated community of volunteers has been working hard to care tree seed collection, bat and owl spotting, for the newly planted trees.

Project Manager, Heather Mack explains: "We planted 6,000 trees earlier this year and are so pleased that over 90% of them are thriving due to the hard work and dedication of our amazing volunteers. We will start blanting again in mid December and need the help of hundreds of volunteers as we plant a further 16,000 trees. Come and join our growing community!"

The planting season is from mid December until the end of March. During this time volunteers will be out tree planting five days a week, from

Wednesday to Sunday. Everyone is invited to get stuck in and help create the new woodland. As well as tree-planting, Great Avon Wood has already been the venue for numerous community events. These have included storytelling, tree ID, family days, and a series of forest school sessions with young people from central Bristol and Pensford Primary School. The ancient Publow Oak has often been the focal point of these events and is a natural heritage feature of the woodland. Find out more and register for

West of England Rural Network (WERN)

Your Community Oil Buying Scheme - buying oil together, to pay lower prices. The West of England Rural Network is a local charity promoting rural sustainability. Already well recognised in the community as the organisation from which the Village Agents operate, they have additionally, over the last 10 years, been successfully operating a syndicate oil buying scheme, aimed at reducing rural fuel poverty. By placing a single, large order once a month and negotiating with multiple national suppliers to get the best price, members may on average pay 6 pence per litre less than the average high street oil price. Thanks to a grant awarded by Quartet Community Foundation, annual membership (*normally £20/year for domestic users) is free for domestic heating oil users aged 70 and over. The scheme is open to all residents, community buildings (£30/year) and businesses (£100/year) within Bath and North East Somerset, North Somerset, South Gloucestershire and Bristol. Pensford Local History Group (PLHG)

Programme of talks for Autumn 2023

• Monday 6th November - Lord's Wood in Pensford - We all have Lord's Wood practically on our doorstep but how many of us know the full story? Andrew Hillman will enlighten everyone about the flora and fauna, the management practices, the challenges faced and the many highlights the woods bring.

Update on the recent workshop on past, present and future flood risks on the River Chew.

30 September 2023 was the day that distinguished academics from the University of Bath and the University of Greenwich met and shared their findings with members of the PLHG as well as local past and present residents from Pensford and others when the River Chew changed the village landscape in just a few hours on 10 July 1968. Dr Thomas Kieldsen from the University of Bath started the day off with an illuminating presentation about the history of DocuFlood which included some very detailed statistics. What was so interesting was to learn that severe floods had affected the area during so many other years including - 1786. 1797, 1876, 1926 and the big freeze of 1947. He also asked if anyone had any additional photos or stories that they would like to share of the floods of 1968. Photographs collated by PLHG and presented by Paul Cooper highlighted the awful havoc and devastation within their village caused by the River Chew on 10 July 1968. By midnight 10 bridges were down. Also included were some photos of the River Avon at Keynsham and the floods that ensued there at the same time. A local resident Paul Hunt.

was often able to advise on the time some of the Pensford photographs were taken as well as identify most of the people included. Peppered throughout his dialogue were some amusing memories of many of the Pensford people shown in the photographs. At that truly difficult time photographers were not really appreciated. Now their importance is being realised through DocuFlood whose main aim is to reduce these happenings in the future. The wider learning and understanding gained from this workshop were of huge benefit to PLHG, residents, visitors and the DocuFlood contacts from the University of Bath as well as the University of Greenwich. It is anticipated that this shared understanding of the flood risk will help to discover valuable insights to safeguard our future.

The audience thanked the academics who attended and participated including Dr Ioanna Stamataki from the University of Greenwich (previously with the University of Bath), Dr Thomas Kjeldsen and Dr Ramtin Sabeti from the University of Bath. Grateful thanks to Pensford Local History Group for their collaboration in organising the event at Pensford Memorial Hall including the particularly welcome cuppas.
