## Concerts at All Saints'

## A good audience were entertained to an outstanding concert by young tenor, Gregory Steward, on a glorious evening, Saturday, 29th July.

Gregory studied initially at Wells Cathedral Choir School and subsequently achieved a First Class degree at the Royal Welsh College of Music and Drama in 2022. He lives near Street and is now embarking on a career as a professional singer.

He entertained us with an eclectic mix of classics and songs from musical shows, culminating in "O Sole Mio" and an encore of "Nessum Dorma". The audience were enchanted and comments overheard afterwards included "I never cry, but I did this evening" and "the best £12 I have spent in years". Gregory said that he had never signed so many autographs. All agreed that this is a young man with a very bright future. We hope to engage him again in 2024.

Looking ahead, we plan for a concert by "Called to be Saints" on Saturday, 28th October, at 4.00pm. We had a taste of what they can do on a Saturday morning last year, which those attending found well worth a proper concert. "Called to be Saints", based in Nailsea, recreate so-called "West Gallery Music", that is church music performed after the Restoration of 1660, until the introduction of church organs in the early 19th century. These choirs, with orchestral backing, performed from elevated galleries at the West end of churches, the far end from the altar, hence the name. Called to be Saints' orchestra supports the choir and performs with instruments of the era. Very few West galleries survive, the nearest being at Cameley. All Saints' once had its own West gallery, the slots where the supporting beams sat can still be seen. Save the date!

### What an opportunity!

This week I was on a Zoom chat with some of our chaplains around the diocese. I meet regularly with eight or nine of them alongside our Chaplaincy Development Adviser Mike Haslam. These are only a few of the more than 300 chaplains we have, of all ages, lay and ordained, across Bath and Wells.

There are more and more enquiries about chaplaincy from a wide range of communities. They are seeking a chaplain to offer pastoral care and well-being support for an increasingly stressed and anxious workforce. One particular enquiry caught my attention this week.



A local Further Education college has been saying that their first concern is for a chaplain to address the spiritual exploration of its students. What an opportunity! We know from the Talking Jesus research (2015 and 2022) that most practising Christians come to faith before the age of 18. Several of our schools, including primary, have pupil chaplains now and this is a great way of recognising that you are never too young to start in living and telling the story of Jesus!

As a child I was always struck by the Old Testament story of the unnamed little slave girl who served Naaman's wife, (2 Kings chapter 5). Taken from her home to another country, and placed in an alien environment, she was the one who introduced Naaman to Elisha the prophet in Israel. As a result, Naaman overcame his scepticism, was healed from his leprosy, and discovered a faith in God.

Chaplaincy opens up a diversity of contexts in which we can share our faith and I invite you to pray for those here in Bath and Wells who are treading new ground to open up the way for others to discover the love of Jesus for themselves. However, each one of us has our own possibility of being a chaplain, coming alongside another in our daily life and community. Sometimes our timidity prevents us from speaking up about faith and our personal spiritual journey other than in church where we are known and on familiar territory. How about taking some time to reflect on where you might live and tell the story of Jesus outside of church, in your everyday context? Is there someone, like a Naaman's wife who is desperate to find help and hope for a loved one but doesn't know where to find it? Maybe you are the only one who could tell them!

### LOCAL GROUPS

#### Pensford Viaduct Open 150 years in September 2023

Pensford viaduct is a striking viaduct spanning the River Chew as it flows towards and through Pensford. The viaduct is believed to have taken around 10 years to build and was completed to coincide with the opening of Pensford Station (which was located in what is now Station Approach) on 3rd September 1873. Although not impacted by the 'Beeching cuts' announced in 1963, the last scheduled passenger train was on 31st October 1959. After this, there were only goods trains which ceased in June 1964 and, thereafter, very occasional excursion trains. It officially closed after the 1968 flood due to the structure having been weakened.

In September 1975, there was a village fair in Pensford and, unbelievably, one of the highlights was an escapologist in a straightjacket escaping from a flying bomb raked out and re-pointed. hanging upside down from the viaduct! Although thankfully not a tragic ending, it seems the rope that suspended the bomb from the plane burned through at some point during the day!

In September 1984, the viaduct was Grade subsequently frozen and then expanded II listed and that same year, it was offered for sale for £1. Although it was offered up for sale with a maintenance grant of £70,000, the associated liabilities meant there were no takers. Ownership and responsibility of the viaduct has varied over the years. When British Rail was privatised in 1994, ownership of the operating railway infrastructure passed to Railtrack and, in 2002, to Network Rail.

During 2002 and 2003, maintenance work was carried out to improve the deck



and its associated drainage with work undertaken on piers, drains and arches. The downpipe hoppers bear the date of 2002.

In August 2015, emergency repairs were carried out where the poor condition of the viaduct had resulted in masonry falling from the eastern parapet onto a public footpath below. Work included the outside face of the parapet being rebuilt and / or repaired. An area of re-pointing on the parapet also took place to ensure its long-term stability and joints between some of the affected coping stones were

During 2022, an inspection was carried out and ecology surveys followed. In the time since the 2003 maintenance. water had been getting into open joints within the parapets and this water had resulting in the mortar popping off. Sadly, each time the cycle of freezing and thawing repeated itself, the problem worsened. So, from April through to September 2023, HRE has implemented a long-term fix. HRE's contractors have worked closely with local heritage officers and have used traditional limebased mortar and a specially designed scaffolding rig which moves on tracks along the full length of the viaduct.




